- -Mission: Helping people and communities become, and remain, economically secure.


National Network of Sector Partners

What is a Sector Initiative?

Industry-specific, regional partnerships that address employers' human resource needs and workers' needs for good jobs



They connect and align workforce development, economic development, education, human services, etc.

They target public resources very effectively

They produce programmatic results and systems changes


 Sector initiatives help with hiring, retention, promotions, and skill development pipelines

Sector Initiatives: Structure


Focus:

- Bring about system change




Sector Initiative Characteristics

- 1. Focus intensively on an industry within a regional labor market, and multiple employers in the industry, over a sustained period of time
- 2. Are led by a workforce intermediary with credibility in the industry
- 3. Create new pathways for low wage workers into the industry, and up to good jobs and careers
- 4. Achieve systemic changes that are "win-win" for employers, workers, and the community.



State Policy Important to Sector Initiatives





State Sector Strategies' Support for Sector Initiatives
